Relieves pain endured by people who live in remote, rural, and underserved communities.



Dear Community,

We care deeply about improving lives. Helping even one person feel better affects their whole community.

Problem: new technologies usually roll out in well-resourced communities. However, people in low-resource communities have the same need for pain relief.

Solution: We are working with a non-profit organization to receive donations and provide grants to our team to lend the Varichrome Pro with training to underserved communities.

Our team proudly introduces the **Lending Library Project**. The purpose is to lend our light therapy technology, called Varichrome[®] Pro, to practitioners in underserved communities.

This project extends PhotoMed's ongoing commitment to serving people who endure chronic pain and impaired functioning. One Varichrome[®] Pro offers the possibility of relief for 100 people in one year, if a practitioner serves only 2 additional people per week.

Individuals, companies, places of worship, organizations, and family foundation donors may suggest communities that they would like us to get connected with. Which communities would you like to receive our technology?

23 years ago, I formed PhotoMed's team of engineers with a vision to relieve pain in communities that would likely never have access to the technology. The reflected gratitude for the therapy has kept me going but is not mine alone to keep.

You can begin to feel that gratitude as we implement that vision together.

We have formed a team with two parts:

- PhotoMed’s team and technology built to restore people’s lives
- an established non-profit designed to help implement the delivery of technologies and services.

PhotoMed’s partnership with a non-profit fiscal sponsor

[L.C. and Lillie Cox Haven of Hope](#) was founded in 2012 with a Mission to offer all individuals, regardless of their economic or social status, the opportunity and support to cope, heal, and grow with dignity.

The **PhotoMed Technologies Project** (we call it the Lending Library Project) is a program of **L.C. and Lillie Cox Haven of Hope** (Sponsor), a nonprofit charity exempted from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and which is not a private foundation because it is described in Sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(a)(vi). The Sponsor retains complete control and discretion of the use of contributions that it receives.

PhotoMed Technologies fulfills the program by building and lending Varichrome Pro devices to practitioners in selected communities. Grants from the L.C. and Lillie Cox Haven of Hope and gifts to PhotoMed's Lending Library Project also support training via printed, online, phone, and Zoom. The device loan period depends upon the size and needs of the communities. The aim is to help as many people as possible. The loaner devices are not for sale, but practitioners are welcome to purchase devices separately from the program.

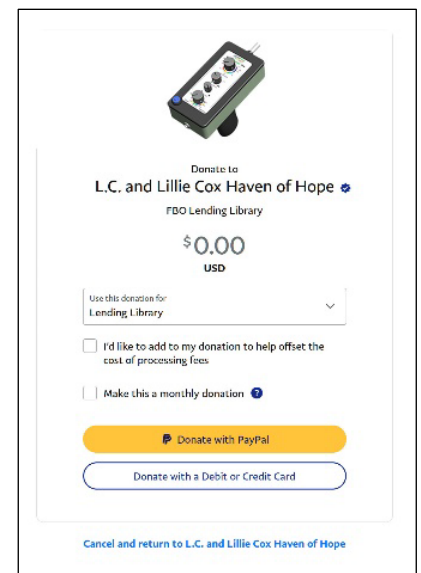
